Narrative: This map was drawn using District Builder, a free tool available to the public. It drills down more granularly at the census block level in attempt to keep as many elementary attendance boundaries and neighborhoods within the limits of proposed By-Trustee Area districts while maintaining **equal population** (less than 10% deviation).

Older neighborhoods (D1 - D3) were drawn with slightly higher populations. District 5 was drawn to accommodate future growth. The **five by-trustee area districts are compact** with District 5 being the least visually compact due to the population being low for the furthest geographic census blocks on the far west side.

The **districts are contiguous**. One slight variation is District 1 which crosses I-80. However, it can be seen as permissible and still contiguous because it has overpasses. It was drawn this way because RCSD families have to travel this route every school day via Cirby and Douglas Blvd overpasses at I-80 to get to Eich Middle School.

This map keeps **83% of neighborhoods** and/or neighborhood associations (a community of interest) which fall within RCSD boundaries intact. This includes South Cirby, Cirby Ranch, Cirby side, Meadow Oaks, Maidu, Sierra Gardens, Stoneridge, Standford, Standford Crossing, Lead Hill, Cresthaven, Hillcrest, Cherry Glen, Thieles Manor, Vineyard, Los Cerritos, Folsom Road, Roseville Heights, Quail Glen, Creekside, Galleria, Historic Sierra Vista, Campus Oaks, West Park, Blue Oaks, Amoruso Ranch, Creekview, Solaire, and Silver Springs. Boundaries split include Highland Reserve, Harding, Diamond Oaks, Kaseburg-Kingswood (slight bend do to Railroad track on the N. side), Sun City, and Fiddymont.

This map keeps **58% of RCSD elementary boundaries** (a community of interest) intact. Attendance Boundaries retained include Sargeant, Stoneridge, Crestmont, Westbrook, Junction, Orchard Ranch, Riego Creek, Kaseberg, Woodbridge, and Diamond Creek. Boundaries split include Cirby, Blue Oaks, Gates (17 homes outside boundary), Thomas Jefferson, Brown, Spanger, and Fiddymont Farm.
