Adderholdt-Elliott, M. (1987). Perfectionism: ***What's bad about being too good?*** Minneapolis, MN: Free Spirit Publishing. This book is intended to be read by students, but is also an excellent resource for teachers. It has an easy reading style with built-in activities.

Delisle, J. (1987). ***Gifted kids speak out.*** Minneapolis, MN: Free Spirit Publishing. Gifted students talk about school, friends, and families in 6000 surveys collected by the author.

Galbraith, J. (1984). ***The gifted kids survival guide: For ages 10 and under.*** Minneapolis, MN: Free Spirit Publishing. This guide includes tips for making school more challenging and interesting, coping with stress, and setting goals.

Galbraith, J. (1983). ***The gifted kids survival guide: For ages 11 -18.*** Minneapolis, MN: Free Spirit Publishing. This book uses the same format as the guide for younger children but addresses issues of the older child.

Galbraith, J. & Delisle, J. (1987). ***The gifted kids survival guide for ages 11-18, vol. II.*** Minneapolis, MN: Free Spirit Publishing. This is a continuation of the first volume.
