Dear students and families:

Welcome back to a new school year at WT Eich Middle School! I am looking forward to meeting with all of you in the near future. This is my seventh year at Eich and I am very excited to be here! This is my eighteenth year teaching Spanish. Before Eich, I taught Spanish at Arcadia High School in Arcadia, CA and at Silverado High School and Veteran's Tribute Career & Technical Academy in Las Vegas, NV.

Just a little about myself: my name is Scott Benedict and I grew up outside of Detroit, MI. I am of Maltese descent (Malta is a small island off the coast of Sicily in the Mediterranean Sea). I moved to Los Angeles when I was twenty. I moved to Las Vegas in 2005 and in 2012 moved to the Sacramento Valley! I took Spanish, German, and French both in high school and in college and can currently speak both Spanish and German. Most of my French has been lost along the way! I began college at Wayne State University in Detroit and graduated from California State University in Northridge, CA. Before I became a teacher, I worked in the travel industry for Northwest Airlines, Princess Cruises, and United Airlines. In addition to being a Spanish teacher, I am also a national presenter and teacher trainer in grading and assessment strategies as well as second-language acquisition methodologies.

My class relies heavily on the TPRS® (Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling) method of foreign-language teaching invented by Blaine Ray. It provides a language-rich environment that promotes foreign-language learning by what sounds right. TPRS® provides natural language acquisition in humorous, non-stressful situations. Strict grammatical instruction is not the focus, but through TPRS®, grammatical correctness is modeled throughout the class within the stories and discussions in much the same way we all learned grammar in our native language.

This type of class is dependent upon ACTIVE participation and develops fluency in Spanish through understandable Spanish language; therefore, the majority of class time will be spent in the target language. Also integral to this method, is actively reading in the target language. To this end, students will be reading a variety of stories, spending thirty minutes per week reading self-selected novels in class, and reading two class novels in Spanish.

Students' progress is directly linked to their level of participation.
